We have one Elder nominee and one Deacon nominee who have agreed to serve one-year terms to fill vacant positions. A brief meeting will be held at the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 12 for the purpose of electing the two nominees.

Max Reed - Elder nominee (one-year term)

A Cradle Presbyterian and a native of South Dakota, Max Reed has lived in several states. She is a professional editor, having worked for a few New York book publishers, retiring here in 2002 with husband Bob. They promptly joined WPPC, and the Chancel Choir a few months later (where she continues to sing). Bob passed away in 2011. They have three children, one living on the East Coast, one on the West Coast, and one in Winter Park who has joined us in the Choir on occasion. Max has served one previous term on Session and is an active member of Community Life. While on the History Committee, she edited WPPC's Memory Book in 2013. Her participation in the Nominating Committee included one year as Chair. She was also on Membership and has taught in VBS. Her community activities include volunteer editing and service on the Boards of several nonprofit organizations, and President of two of them.

Jeanne Vinci - Deacon nominee (one-year term)

Jeanne and her family were first embraced by the good people of Winter Park Presbyterian Church in 1985 while registering daughters Madeleine and Allison for Sunday School after a move from Ann Arbor, Michigan. Access to a dynamic Christian Education experience for the girls was the priority but soon Richard and Jeanne found themselves swept up into classes and activities which offered substance as well as authentic relationships. The biblical foundation fostered by loving generations prepared their girls for the myriad of challenges that are part of the military/nomadic life. In fact, they will attest that the lessons and laughter of WPPC years continue to serve them well in their careers.

Upon reflection, opportunities to explore leadership were first extended to Jeanne by trusting members who gently mentored and encouraged as she developed skills that would serve congregations and commands in the future. For Jeanne recognized that organizing a week long spouse leadership seminar with a diverse volunteer staff is not that different from chairing a CE meeting. Likewise, championing a program that holds promise for military families in a room filled with generals mirrors addressing members of session – almost!

Upon return as retirees five years ago, Jeanne and Richard were again embraced and found opportunities for service in the kitchen through Community Life and Friendship Club, in the gardens and around the expanse of buildings assisting Property, as members of the WPPC choir and VBS volunteers. Jeanne's Stephen Ministry Leadership credentials allow her to serve behind the scenes in support of this next promising generation of WPPC leaders.


Souper Bowl of Caring
