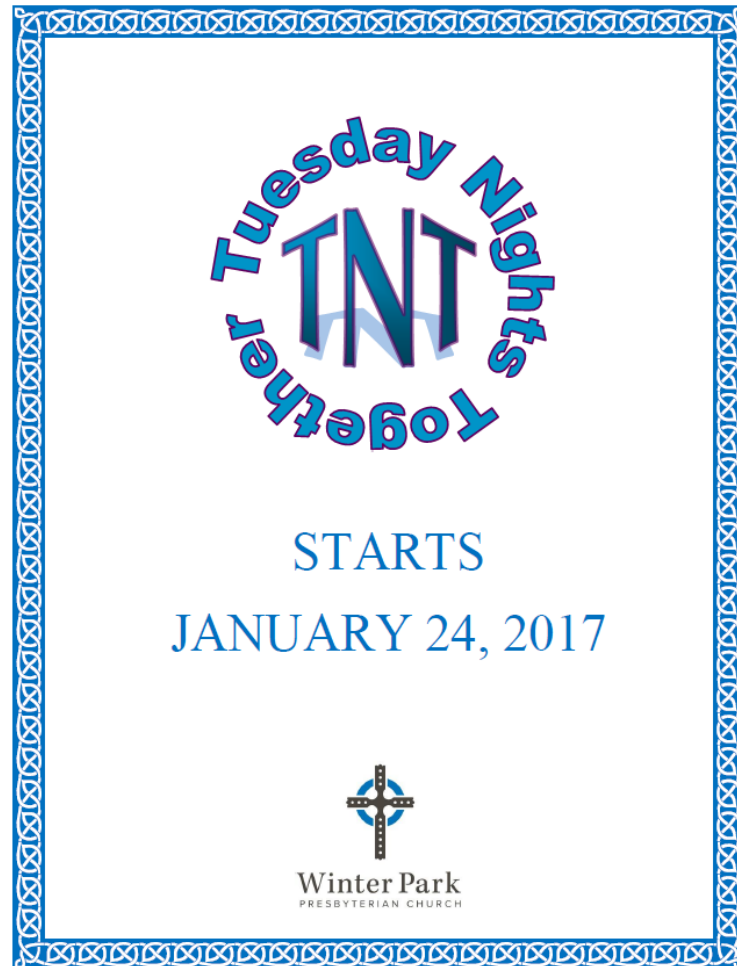
Flower Dedications in the New Year
