5 Cents A Meal

Next Sunday, January 23, we will take the first quarterly collection for 5 Cents A Meal this year. Please continue your support for PATH (Presbyterian's Answer To Hunger). The offering is sent to Presbytery, which divides the monies among Second Harvest Food Bank (25%), Society of St. Andrew (SOSA) (gleaning local fields - 21%), Alliance for International Reforestation (AIR) in Guatemala (planting fruit trees and installing fuel-efficient brick stoves in remote poverty-stricken villages - 21%), and Dan and Elizabeth Turk PC (USA) mission workers in Madagascar (training seminary students in planting/cultivating fruit trees, and helping Elizabeth implement a community health program, teaching AIDS awareness and advising the family planning program - 21%). Twelve percent covers administrative costs.

January 23 - The Holy Land Revealed: The Hasmonean Kingdom

The Maccabean revolt ultimately resulted in the establishment of the Hasmonean Kingdom that was controlled by a series of ruthless rulers. This session will explore their actions and the series of events that set the stage for annexation by the Romans. The lesson will also focus on the Nabateans, a group of Arab people centered in Petra, who grew wealthy through the establishment of caravan routes and dealing in expensive items from the east such as myrrh and frankincense.
