Lost Kitchen Items

As our Coalition cooks began to work their magic to prepare the 7-layer salad to be served at the Coalition on Friday, December 10, they were unable to locate 2 of the 6 large pans used to layer, mix and serve the salad (dimensions 20" x 12" and 6" deep). After a complete search of the church, the team used 4 smaller pans to replace the 2 missing. This led to difficulty refrigerating 8 rather than 6 pans and transporting more pans to and from the Coalition. In addition, the team found many knives missing that normally hang on the wall under the AC controls. These items are critical to WPPC's "Mission to Feed the Homeless" and will have to be replaced.
