Meeting the needs of the homeless in our communities is an issue many individuals and congregations are trying to find ways to address. The function of Homeward Bound, a ministry of Orlando Presbyterian Church is twofold - part financial and part relational. It provides specific financial assistance to partner churches for meeting the needs of our homeless neighbors through (a) reunification with supportive family and friends or (b) providing emergency housing in a critical situation. These partners are Second Harvest Food Bank (distributes meals to partner feeding programs across our six-county area); Society of St. Andrew (SoSA) which coordinates gleaning events with volunteers to provide fresh, nutritious produce to local food banks; Alliance for International Reforestation (AIR) in Guatemala which plants trees to provide fruit and prevent mudslides; and Madagascar Project (Dan and Elizabeth Turk, PC (USA) Missionaries) allows Dan to train seminary students to plant and cultivate fruit trees and Elizabeth to implement a community health program, teach AIDS awareness and advise the family planning program.
