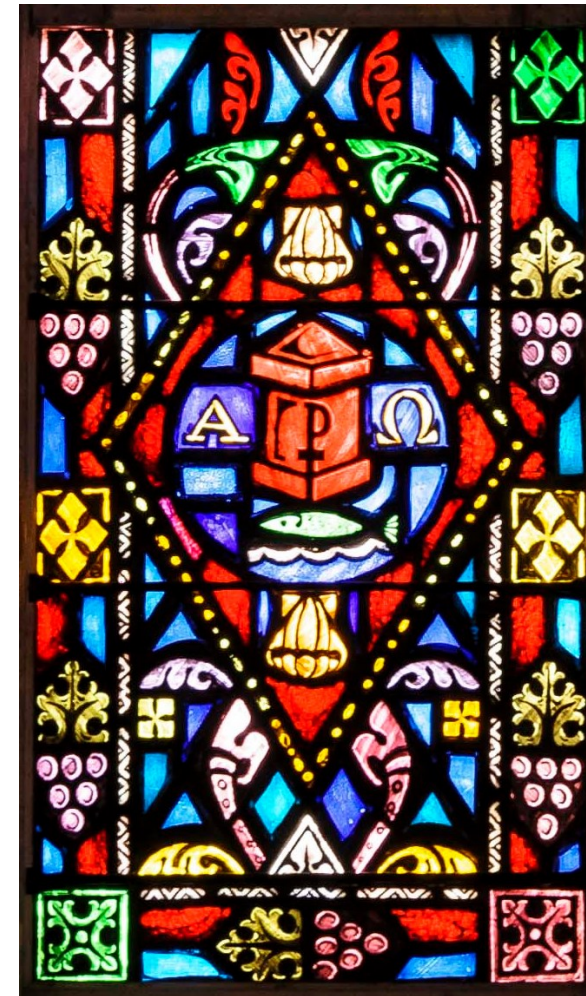

Baptism is symbolized in the left lancet. In the lowest panel is the font containing baptismal water, with Alpha and Omega, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, on either side signifying that Christ is from all time to all time. On the font is seen the Green monogram for Christus, the Christ. Just below the font is a fish, the secret symbol of the early Christians when to be known as such meant persecution and death.

Guest Organist


