October 13th—Faith and the Opioid Crisis

The opioid epidemic continues to ravage our community and nation, with over 100 Americans dying each day from prescription pain pill or heroin overdose. Rick Van Warner is the author of *On Pills & Needles: The Relentless Fight to Save My Son from Opioid Addiction*, and a leader of Project Opioid, a central Florida alliance of faith, business, law enforcement, government and healthcare leaders working on solutions to address the problem. Rick will discuss the role his Christian faith played in helping him cope with the chaos and despair created by his son's life and death battle, and how his family's love and perseverance helped his son survive. He'll also discuss the need to overcome stigma within the faith community and society regarding the opioid crisis, and will share information about the link between mental health and substance abuse. Discussion will be led by Mike Galyean.
