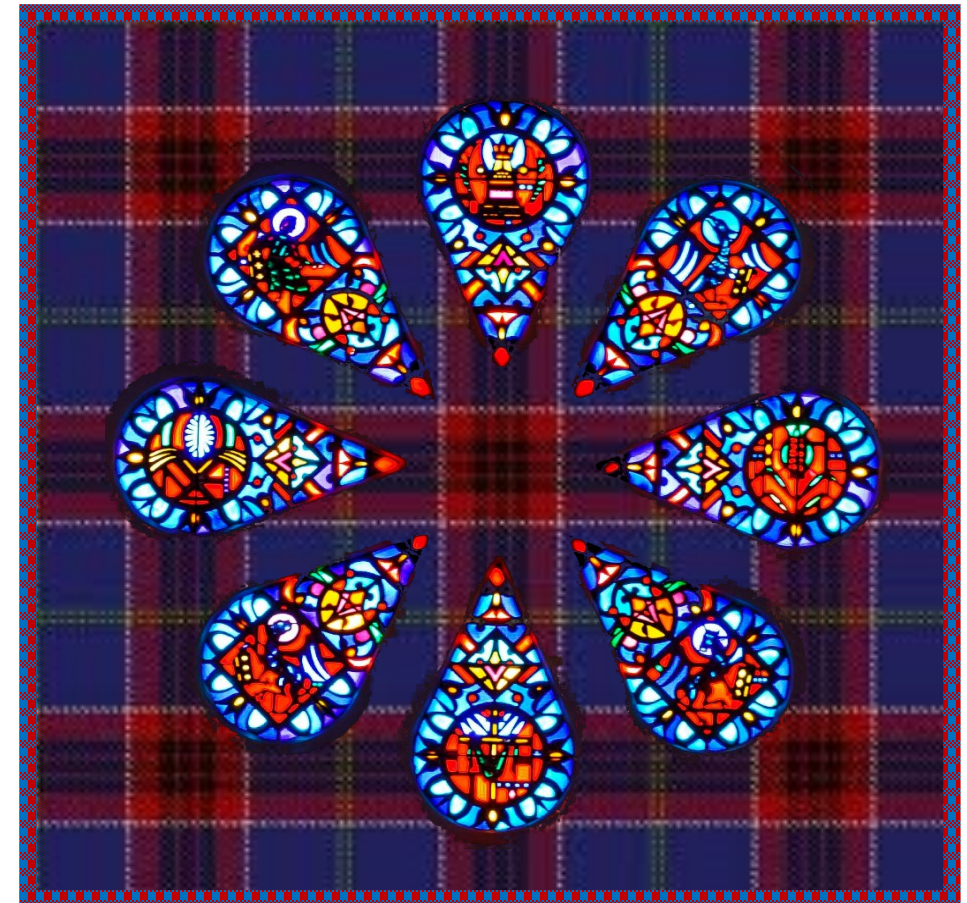

## WELCOME TO WINTER PARK PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Today's service celebrates Christian unity, courage, and commitment to our Lord. It is Reformation Sunday when Martin Luther in the service of Christian truth nailed a list of 95 theses to the door of All Saints Church in Wittenburg, sparking the Protestant Reformation.

We will also observe the "Kirkin o' the Tartans." This ceremony was first conducted by the Rev. Peter Marshall, pastor of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, DC during the 1940's and also, chaplain of the US Senate. Rev. Marshall was a native of Scotland and held the service as a symbol of solidarity with the British and Scots during the Second World War. Proceeds from that service were used to fund a mobile kitchen for those who had been displaced by the bombings of Nazi Germany. When celebrated today it not only recognizes the Scottish roots of Presbyterianism, but it is also a call to people of every nation and heritage to come together in love and commitment to faith and truth.

Finally, as an act of commitment to the church in this place we will dedicate our pledges and ourselves to the work of WPPC in 2019.

### **Sunday School**

Children: Nursery for ages 1 month-3 years (608), Ages 3 years-Grade 2 (101), Grades 3-5 (201)

At Winter Park Presbyterian Church we are blessed to host Sunday School classes for young and elementary aged children. Both classes use a curriculum called Deep Blue, which invites children to explore the stories of the Bible through video, crafts, games, and mission. In Sunday School they will begin to form the building blocks for a lifelong, deep faith in Christ.

Adults & Youth: Relations in Action (301), Seekers (315)

Relationships in Action (R in A): Relationships in Action is an adult Sunday School class that studies issues "with the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other." Each week features a different theme and a different speaker to present each topic. They are interested in social issues that affect their lives and the lives of others and how we as followers of Christ can be a factor in positive change.

Seekers: The Seekers is a discussion based adult Sunday school class that studies a wide variety of topics ranging from Books of the Bible to Theology to Current Events. They are a support group that spends time in fellowship as well as discussion and they are able to disagree, yet move in a positive direction during their discussions.
