Celebration and Thanks from our Cuban Partners

The ship container sponsored by the Cuban Partnership has arrived in Cuba. The goods are being distributed by representatives of the Cuban Presbyterian Church to individual churches to help their communities. The container contains rice, beans, powdered milk, coffee, soap, detergents, and syringes to meet important requested needs. Winter Park Presbyterian Church through the Compassion Committee and individual members helped make this possible.

Beginning in January, 2022 the Compassion Committee needs a volunteer to reheat the meat/pasta dish in the WPPC kitchen before we serve it at the Coalition. We alternate preparing the pasta/meat dish or 7-layer salad each month so the reheating would only be needed 6 times per year—January, March, May, July, September, November (odd numbered months). The task begins at 1:30 PM and ends by 4:00 PM on the 2nd Friday of those months.
