Relationships in Action - Sunday Mornings at 9:15 AM in Room 301 December 29th—Casa de Paz Colorado

Matt Pickler will share his experiences in volunteering for a privately funded social outreach program in the Denver area. Located only a few miles from an immigrant detention center, *Casa de Paz* (House of Peace) offers housing, meals, visits and emotional support to families separated by immigrant detention. It also provides assistance to men and women who have been released from detention and need a place to stay as they make arrangements to return to their families. Detention is a difficult time that tears families apart and creates a financial burden, so all services are offered free of cost. Since first opening its doors, *Casa la Paz* has hosted over 2,300 immigrants from thirty countries.
