The trip's purpose is to explore establishing a relationship between the Winter Park Presbyterian Church and one or more churches in Cuba. It is customary to take our Cuban church hosts small, practical gifts of items often lacking in their environment. Among the items on the list are Included the following over-the-counter medications: Antibiotic Ointment, Aspirin, Benadryl (or something similar), Children's Ibuprofen, Children's Tylenol, Diaper Rash Cream, Glucosamine, Hemorrhoidal Ointment, Hydrocortisone Cream, Ibuprofen, Lubricant Eye Drops, Mucus Relief Chest Congestion, Multivitamins for Adults, Multivitamins for Children, Omega 3 Fish Oil, Topical Analgesic Cream (Menthol), Vitamin C, Vitamin E. You can give any donated items to Mary, Melanie, or Peter. You can also drop them off in the front office.
