WPPC Mission to "Feed the Homeless" Resumes

The Compassion Committee is delighted to announce that the WPPC mission of "Feeding the Homeless" at the Central Florida Coalition for the Homeless will resume in-person serving on Friday, April 9. Although the Covid-19 crisis will have kept us away for 13 months, we have continued to support our friends at the Coalition by donating the cost of the food we would have brought so the kitchen staff could purchase and serve the meal themselves.

- We will now serve on the 2nd Friday of each month.
- ♦ All food will be served in the Men's Service Center to women and children first, then to men living there. The Coalition staff is preparing the food served to the Community guests.
- ♦ Because we will not be serving the Community (those not living on-site) in April, we will not use the following teams at this time: Make & bag PB&J sandwiches and sort & bag toiletries.
- We will depart the church at 4:00 PM and only 5 servers from our church can attend.
