Food items donated for delivery to the local Food Pantry are no longer being collected. Instead, the Deacons ask that our congregation support the church’s food related humanitarian projects throughout the year, as well as the PC(USA) Special Collections. These include: **P.A.T.H.** (Presbyterian Answer To Hunger) “5 Cents a Meal” collections, 4x / year. Remaining 2025 collections are on July 27 & October 26. Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida and Society of St. Andrew’s (fresh produce) are both beneficiaries; **Soup-er Bowl of Caring Sunday** (donate canned & boxed food for delivery to a food pantry): Sunday, Feb 8, 2026; **One Great Hour of Sharing** (Easter Sunday offering): PC (USA) distributes 36% of donations to the Presbyterian Hunger Program and the rest to other human service efforts.
