From "His House ... and Ours," a compilation of photographs and history of the stained glass windows of Winter Park Presbyterian Church. The Rose Window, located in the front of the Sanctuary, consists of "spokes" showing the aspects of the life of Christ. At "nine o'clock" the Incarnation is shown by the nativity manger, at "six o'clock" our Savior's vicarious sacrifice, the Crucifixion; at "three o'clock" our Lord's glorious Resurrection and victory over death; at "twelve o'clock" Christ the King. In the other four spokes, reading counter-clockwise, are the traditional symbols, "the "winged creatures" of the Four Evangelists. The winged man is Matthew, the winged lion is Mark, the winged ox is Luke, and the eagle is John.
