Car Circle Courtesies

We are always working to make improvements to car circle. Here are a few reminders:

- 1. When in car circle, please do not stop in the crosswalk. Instead stop at the white line.
- 2. Always use your car sign, and keep it visible until you exit the property. If you need more car signs, let us know.
- 3. Car circle begins at 9:00 a.m. but may start a few minutes earlier if all teachers are in place. Afternoon car circle begins at 1:00 p.m.
- 4. Pull up in car circle close to the car in front of you to allow as many cars as possible to fit in the driveway, keeping cars out of the road.
- 5. After your child is placed in your car, pull up as far as you can in the driveway to buckle up (at least 3 car lengths) so that we can continue to load cars behind you.
- 6. Early drop off care is available only if you have signed up in the office for the school
- 7. If you are struggling, please come to the office to speak to Tricia Wilson, Director, so that we can accommodate your needs.
- 8. Please be courteous to other drivers. Thank you!

Always hold your child's hand when in the parking lot

If you have more children than hands, we will assist you. This is our most important rule and the staff will remind you to follow it. We have never had a serious accident at drop off or dismissal time and want to avoid a potential tragedy.

MailChimp is an email service that we use to communicate with parents regarding upcoming events and activities.

Enrollsy is the app we use for attendance and to send text messages to parents regarding important updates and upcoming events. Enrollsy texts are also used for weather delays to car line or other types of emergencies.

Toilet Training Policy

When a child seems interested and ready, parents should start to toilet train at home. If the child shows progress, parents should inform the teachers at the beginning of a school week. At that point the child should come to school in pull-ups with Velcro side closure. The teacher will ask the child if they have to go to the bathroom every hour or so. If the child expresses a wish to go to the bathroom, will be taken immediately. Also, the child will be taken to the bathroom at scheduled times (before playground time, etc.).

A child is considered trained when they consistently ask to be taken to the bathroom and stay clean and dry throughout the entire school day.

If the child soils their underwear two times in one day or has accidents for three consecutive days, the child must begin to wear pull-ups to school again until they are able to stay consistently dry and clean.
