Independent but Safe, Smart but Not Pushed, **Ready but Remarkably Individualistic!**

Some of the most important goals we have for teaching young children are to:

- develop their skills of independence while keeping them safe
- develop their skills of intelligence while using developmentally appropriate practice (DAP)
- develop their skills of "readiness" while not stifling their personal creativity and spirit

At school we want your child to be able to Select, Act, Reflect, Repeat, and Apply their learning (and we call this SARRA). Each child needs to be able to choose activities, play experiences and toys from an array of developmentally appropriate ones; participate in learning experiences; use gestures, words, art, conversation/discussion, and eventually writing to recall and express themselves about what they did; practice the skills as many times as they need to in order to feel comfortable with them; and finally put their learning to use in both traditional and original ways.

You can help your children with these important skills by encouraging them to make choices and decisions, find and procure what they need without assistance, try to take actions and do things for/by themselves rather than having an adult do for them, and allowing them to learn from those attempts (make mistakes) without judgement, critique or commandeering the tasks yourself. Here are some examples:

- Ask babies and toddlers to use a word or two before giving them their juice.
- Allow Twos and Threes to choose what they will wear (from appropriate clothing).
- Encourage Fours and Fives to make simple decisions about their actions and include them
- in daily housekeeping chores and family events.

Independence is vital to your child's development. To encourage this at school we ask your children to do everything for themselves that is developmentally appropriate for their age and abilities. Toddlers can feed themselves; Twos can carry their backpacks and put them away; Threes can clean up after snacks or meals and return their toys to original locations when they are finished playing; Fours can open their lunchboxes, their food and drink packages, set the table, and assist their friends with these things; Fives can take care of all their personal hygiene needs, have conversations at meal/snack time, and clean up after meals and play time.

It may seem easier to just do it yourself, but the quality of learning and the independence your child will gain will increase their intelligence and their readiness for the rest of their lives.
