The upper window is about Matthew. Matthew's name (Gift of Jehovah) appears in each of the lists of apostles. In Mark and Luke he is called Levi; in the gospel with his name in Acts he is called Mathew. Perhaps Jesus may have given Levi that name. Perhaps Matthew himself chose it after Jesus called him and he began a new life of a disciple. Levi had been a publican who served as a tax collector under Rome. In his gospel Matthew calls himself by the new name adding publican to point out what he had been but was no more.

Five times in the New Testament he is mentioned. Four times in the list of apostles and once when our Lord calls him from the custom table in Capernaum. Publican he was abut an apostle he became.



Capernaum, by the Sea of Galilee, sat near the *Great West Trunk Road* where traffic passed from Damascus and the Far East to the Mediterranean. Rome exacted its tolls from both road and sea. It was in the custom house there that Levi collected taxes for Caesar and probably for himself. Publicans (especially Jewish ones) who worked under Rome were hated and despised by their countrymen. They were outcasts of their society and debarred from worship and their synagogues. Matthew was one of these when Jesus called him to follow Him.

That call did not come at first sight. Levi's custom house was near the seashore where Jesus taught and preached. Levi knew about Jesus both by ear and sight. By the time our Lord

called him he was ready for the new name and new life. To celebrate the surprise of that joy he gave a great feast and invited his new master and the only others who would come to his home—his fellow publicans and sinners.

A tax official of the Roman government with his custom house near an international highway, Matthew was an educated man who knew languages and how to use his pen. And he did. He wrote the gospel which bears his name. The symbol on his shield (the 3 money bags) portrays his office as a tax collector. But they also say that he left all, rose up, and followed Him.



JESUS' FAMILY TREE


Matthew records a timeline of Jesus' family dating back to Abraham. Do you know who is in Jesus' family tree?




